As required by sections 705 and 735 of the Tariff Act of 1930, the United States International Trade Commission has completed countervailing duty investigations concerning imports of aluminum extrusions from China, Indonesia, Mexico, and Turkey and antidumping duty investigations concerning imports of aluminum extrusions from China, Colombia, Ecuador, India, Indonesia, Italy, Malaysia, Mexico, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, and Vietnam (Investigation Nos. 701-TA-695-698 and 731-TA-1643-1644 and 1646-1657 (Final)). You are hereby advised that the Commission has determined that an industry in the United States is not materially injured or threatened with material injury by reason of imports of such merchandise that are sold in the United States at less than fair value and subsidized by the governments of China, Indonesia, Mexico, and Turkey.

The reasons for the Commission's determinations are set forth in its report on the investigations.
