Dear Secretary Marsh:

As required by sections 705 of the Tariff Act of 1930, the United States International Trade Commission has completed countervailing duty investigations concerning imports of frozen warmwater shrimp from China, Ecuador, India, Malaysia, and Vietnam (Investigation Nos. 701-TA-491-493, 495 and 497 (Final)). You are hereby advised that the Commission determined that an industry in the United States is not materially injured or threatened with material injury, and the establishment of an industry in the United States is not materially retarded by reason of imports of such merchandise that are subsidized by the Governments of China, Ecuador, India, Malaysia, and Vietnam.

The Commission's determinations in these investigations, together with the reasons therefor, are set forth in the enclosed copy of the Commission's report on the investigations. The determinations will be published in the Federal Register.
